Being Safe, Respectful and Responsible

I would like to highlight to all community members our school's Matrix of Expectations as communicated in the first newsletter of this year and in the little brochure that your child brought home last week..

I would like to reiterate the role that we **all** play in creating a safe and happy school environment, where every child has the right to learn. To enact these rights, we have shared expectations of all members of our community.

As we do with our students, I am especially asking that you make an extra effort to enact the following behaviours when engaging in our school community, modelling to our children **safe, respectful and responsible** behaviours:

- We are calm and use appropriate language when speaking to others.
- We help, look out for and support others.
- We worry about ourselves and the things that affect us.

Let's help each other out! ❤️ ❤️ If your child happens to bring an item home that does not look like it belongs to them, can you please model to them that we take responsibility by returning it to the rightful owner.



Collection of Students During the School Day

If you are planning to collect your child/ren early from the Office, then you need to present the administration staff with photo identification. This process is in line with our Duty of Care policy. If you organise to have somebody else collect your child/ren, you must ensure that they are listed as an emergency contact or have been authorised by you, the parent/carer to collect the student.

If you are picking up a student during play break, we ask that you contact the Office prior to picking them up so that we can ensure their bag is at the Office. This is because all classrooms are locked during break times.

Mobile Phones in Schools

Given the Department's position on mobile phones in schools, I did want to highlight our policy here at Wooranna Park. As per the [Mobile Phone policy](#), 'a mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network'. For this policy, 'mobile phone' refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone, such as 'smart watches'. I ask that you familiarise yourself with this policy in support of your child/ren understanding our school's requirements and processes.

Please note that **Monday 11 March** is a Public Holiday, so students are **not** to come to school.



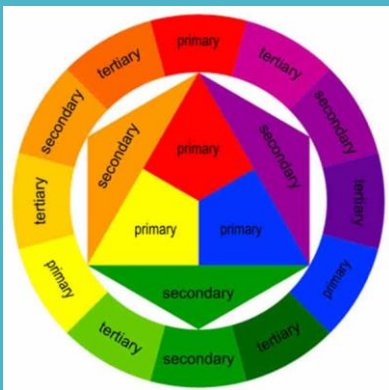

Visual Arts

To start off their first Visual Art classes the 3/4's have had the chance to make their own play dough and then experiment with what they can create. This was the first set on their way to making a final clay model based on their experiments and designs.

Grade 5/6 have begun to create their own Daruma, a goal setting doll used in Japan, out of Paper Mache. The process takes some time but so far, they have made a great start.

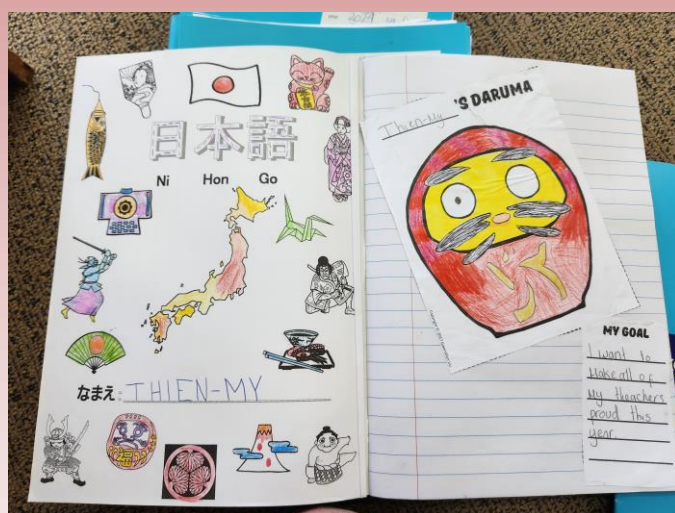

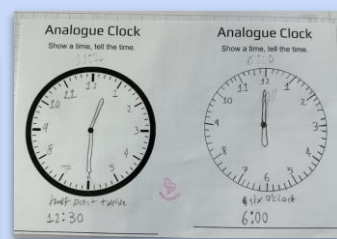
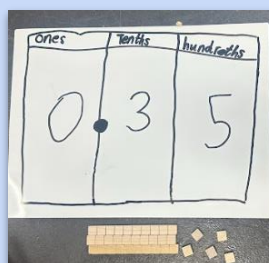
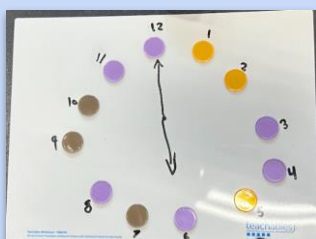
INQUIRY

In inquiry, we have begun immersing ourselves into our mentor text 'Looking After Country With Fire' by Victor Steffenson. We have been further exploring this text through our weekly history, geography and art lessons.



MATHS

In maths we have been learning to recognise, represent and order numbers. We have also been learning about the properties of analogue and digital clocks.





EARTH & SPACE SCIENCES

This year, we introduced a new unit focusing on Earth that will progress to space and planets later in the term.

- Initially, we delved into detailed weather analysis.
- This coincided with a significant storm in the third week, where the rain catchers made by the 1/2 students proved useful, collecting over 2cm of rain in a 24-hour period. However, the homemade anemometers created by the 3/4 students struggled due to the strong winds.
- Meanwhile, senior school students explored landforms like volcanoes, various mountain types, rivers, and glaciers. They examined concrete volcano models underwater and used puzzles to illustrate tectonic plate formations along the Earth's crust.
- In the junior school, students studied day and night cycles and how the sun and moon influence our activities.
- Grade 1/2 engaged in a painting activity to feel the textures of the sun and moon, while the Prep students explored these concepts through drawings and games.
- Additionally, they began learning about the seasons.

SUNSMART REMINDERS

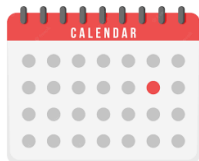

Please note that our school grounds are supervised by school staff at the following times:

- Before school from 8:30am to 9am
- Throughout recess and lunch
- After school from 3:30pm to 3:45pm.

Our gates are locked each afternoon at 3:45pm. Students in the school grounds after this time will be cared for at VillageOHSC at the family's expense.

The school grounds are not supervised outside of the above times.

It is important that families understand that the park, opposite the school, is not supervised by staff before or after school.

While some families use this area as a meeting place, please know children must be supervised by an adult, as per the Greater Dandenong Council's direction.

It takes a village to raise a child and we are yours! Village OSHC partners with schools Australia-wide to keep children safe and happy outside school hours as parents work or study. In our care, children make new friends, build on old friendships, get exercise, eat healthy food, embrace their imagination and have loads of fun in a safe and respectful environment.

Our after-school care program is run by Village OSHC. They operate **After School Care from 3.30pm to 6pm, Monday to Thursday.**

All families are strongly encouraged to register their child/ren for VillageOSHC as it is free to enrol and while you are under no obligation to use the service it does provide support for you in the event of an emergency. MOBILE DEVICES

In line with the Department of Education's [Mobile Phone policy](#), all phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely in the front Office, during the school day.

A **mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to **mobile phones and any device** that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smartwatch.

When a student is not complying with this mobile phone policy, we will be required to follow a process in accordance with our existing student engagement policies.

Subway lunch orders are available each Friday. There is a pre-ordering system and orders must be placed via XUNO by **4pm each Tuesday** for the Friday's lunch.

SAFETY

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia

For Term One and Four, we wear our named, broad brimmed, navy blue hat at all times when outside.

PROTECT

Everyone has the right to be safe and be protected from abuse.

No one should behave in a way that makes you feel unsafe or afraid, including anyone in your family, anyone at school or anywhere else in the community.

Tell a teacher or any adult at your school if you feel unsafe.



It's everyone's responsibility.

Adults at school must listen and respond to concerns about child abuse.

If you suspect abuse of any child or young person, you have a responsibility to report it, even if you are not sure.
