*Hi everyone,*

It was wonderful to hear back from a parent recently that their child is loving our after hours school care, now with VillageOSHC, so much so that they do not want to leave each afternoon!



I do suggest that **all** parents/carers register their child/ren, as while you are under no obligation to use this service, it could be a support for you in the event of an emergency. You do have to put in a credit card to complete the enrolment. The credit card will have a \$0.98 cent charge on it to verify it as a real card. That small charge will go into your LookedAfter account and can be put towards your first bill, if you use the service. If you do not end up using this service, that amount will remain until you close your LookedAfter account and will be credited back onto your card.

Details of the cost and how to enrol are included on the following page. I strongly encourage you to consider utilising this service.

### XUNO

With Seesaw recently changing its format we are strongly encouraging everyone to transition to XUNO. A few pages into this newsletter you will find a detailed outline of some of the features you can find within the XUNO app, helping to make communication with the school quick and easy while giving you access to information, without having to sit at a computer.



With many families booking their student led conference using this tool already this term we are really keen to get everyone onboard!

### Camps Beyond 2022

In response to our recent camp experience, with low attendances at our two camps (72% of grade 5s and 53% of grade 6s), we are giving serious thought to how we proceed with camps in the future.

We recognise that due to cultural reasons some families are not wanting their child attending an overnight event and these events do require a bigger financial commitment.

At our recent School Council meeting we presented that we are giving thought to only offering a camp in grade five or six (even years only e.g. 2024) and then doing an adventure day in the other year. We also think our grade 3 and 4 students would benefit from an adventure day each year, potentially involving a long day excursion to places such as Melbourne City, Enchanted Maze, Phillip Island, Sovereign Hill or Moonlight Sanctuary, just to name a few possibilities. Once details have been confirmed we will communicate further information.

In the meantime, if you have a child in **grade three and four**, please give serious consideration to allowing them to attend their up and coming camp, planned for the final week of this term. They may not get another opportunity for an overnight stay until 2024. Forest Edge is highly rated by the staff of Wooranna Park Primary School as a great camp!



### Time to Plan Ahead!

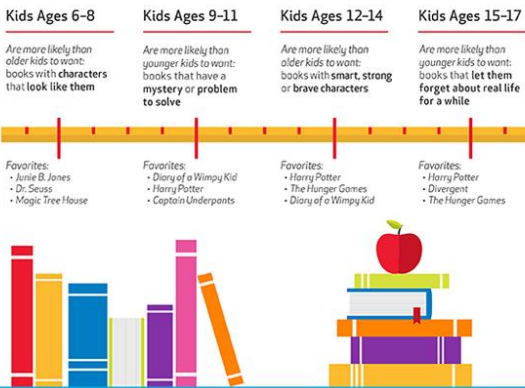

## Promoting Reading

In an effort to remain on top of the latest research in education, I recently completed a course at La Trobe University titled "Science of Language and Reading."

This course confirmed the direction that we are taking at Wooranna Park in ensuring a **structured literacy approach**, particularly in our junior school, so that our students are strong readers who keep their eyes on the text and can decode through unfamiliar words. Within this evidence informed approach we are teaching students the skills to handle unknown words while expecting them to be regularly checking for understanding so they are making sense of the text they are reading. This is so important given that reading is a secondary skill, not a biologically, primary skill like learning how to talk.

Our early readers utilise decodable books with the majority of the words being ones they can read and spell. However, all of this work does not come at the expense of a rich oral language environment as we aim for very high levels of success for **ALL** students.

As such I ask that you please keep track and assist your child in their learning by reading to and with them as much as possible, in partnership with our Wooranna Park staff. Together we need to expose our children to beautiful books on a daily basis: books that expand their vocabularies, their comprehension of complex sentences, their imaginations, and their knowledge of the world.

I also strongly encourage you to promote a love of reading with your child by visiting our **Book Fair** which will be held in the Conference Room 2 next week. There will be some great books on offer, appropriate to your child/ren's age and interests.

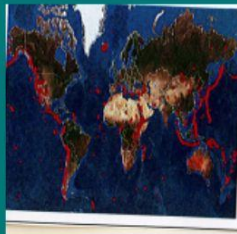
## STRUCTURE

We compiled a list of questions and began to explore the world of fact and fiction online.

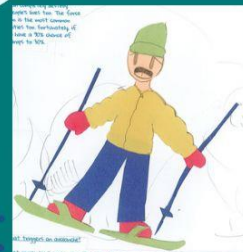

### Blizzards

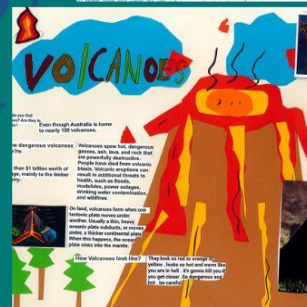
A Blizzard is a severe snowstorm that happens because of low temperatures and causes a big amount of snow to damage the power lines/heaters inside of the house.

This is where we got creative, looking to catch our readers eye using colour, images and themes on a poster.










### What do avalanches look like?

There are two types of avalanches, which are sluff and slab. Sluff avalanches are loose and powdery and don't usually cause as much damage. Slab avalanches are the more disastrous type. They occur when huge chunks of snow crack off and slide down. With enough time, the bottom of an avalanche can become as hard as concrete!

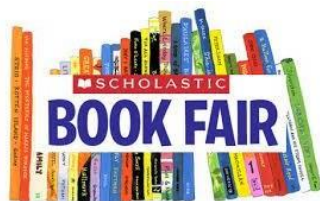
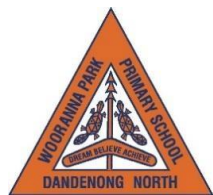
### How much damage does an avalanche cause?

Avalanches can destroy anything which dares to come near. They can completely destroy houses, stacks, cabins, and whole forests. Avalanches can destroy people's lives too. The force of an avalanche can break bones, causing serious injury. Asphyxiation is the most common cause of most fatalities. Hypothermia is the cause of some fatalities too. Fortunately, if someone buried under an avalanche is found within 15 minutes, they have a 90% chance of survival. But if they're found within 35 minutes the survival rate drops to 30%.

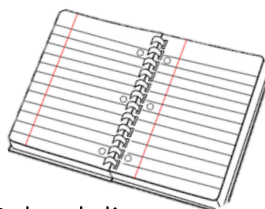
Your child's teacher will offer you a range of opportunities to communicate with them.

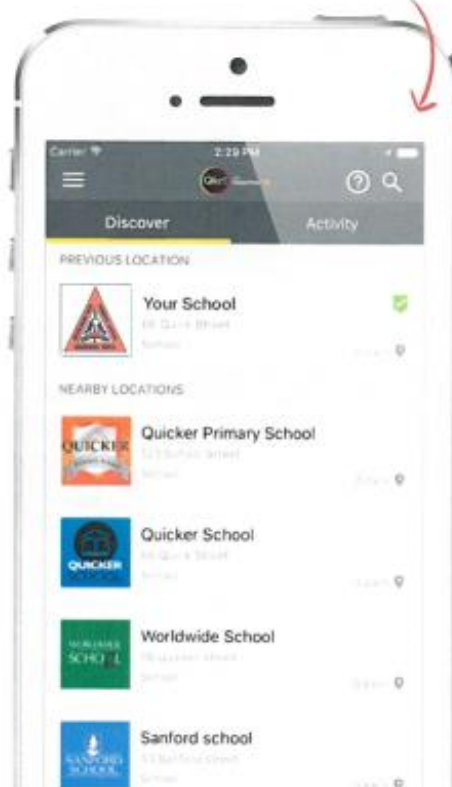

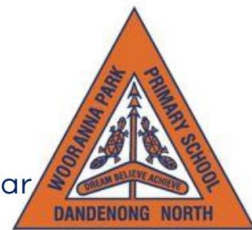
