## Splash's Learn to Swim School

This year the **school's Swimming Program** will take place at Splash's Learn to Swim School on Stud Road, Dandenong. Our intensive swimming program for Preps to Grade Six will be on:

- Monday 6 November
- Wednesday 8 November
- Thursday 9 November
- Friday 10 November 2023

Learning to swim is a crucial part of your child's growth and development and an important component of the school curriculum. Splash's Learn to Swim Schools' focus is to provide high quality experienced instructors in an environment where students of all ages can progress rapidly. The approach to the Swim & Survive program is two prong: Water Safety & Stroke Development. Austswim qualified instructors are running the classes and will focus on providing an environment that enables students to fulfill their swimming potential.

The swim sessions will be 45 minutes in duration. Qualified instructors will teach ability groups with a maximum of 8 students. Students will be transported by bus, between WPPS and Splash's Learn to Swim School, by Victorian Touring Coaches throughout the day.

Parents/carers will be welcome to meet us there to watch their child's swimming progress. If you would like to help your child dress after swimming, you **must have a Working with Children Check**. This is a legal requirement that Splash's Learn to Swim School must adhere to. Any parents/carers wishing to attend will need to make their own way to and from the centre as we **do not** have any spaces available on the bus. Please note, that while we encourage parent/carer help during this time, it is also important to assist the children in further developing their independence and to learn to dress and dry themselves.

This year the Department of Education has provided funding to subsidise the swimming programs held in primary schools which enables WPPS to offer this program at a reduced cost to our families.

Please pay and approve on XUNO by **4pm on Monday 30 October 2023** to secure your child/ren's position for this program. If your XUNO account does show a zero balance, then that is indicating that you have access to CSEF funds for this program and payment is not required.

If your children are attending this program, then we do require you to complete this electronic Swimming Skills Assessment form to ensure they are allocated to an appropriate group:

**2024 Student Enrolments.**

We are now in the process of looking at our **student enrolment numbers for 2024** at each year level, in readiness for structuring our teaching teams and grades.  
If you do not intend to be at Wooranna Park PS next year, can I please ask that you advise the Office in writing immediately.  
Or if you know of a family or student who will be attending Wooranna Park PS in 2024 and is not currently enrolled, please encourage them to contact the Office on 9795 2007 ASAP.

In 2024, we will continue running multi-age classes from grade one through to grade six. This will mean students will be grouped in either a grade 1/2 class, a grade 3/4 class or a grade 5/6 class, as they have been this year. Prep will be the only single year level class. We believe this structure is best due to the variation in enrolment numbers from year to year.

The term 'multi-age' in its simplest form refers to 'a class comprised of children of different ages intentionally grouped for learning'. Multi-age classes are very common in schools within our local network of primary schools and more broadly for several reasons..

At Wooranna Park Primary School this structure provides us with more options for placing children and teachers, while enabling more even class sizes and distribution of individual needs across classes. This school structure also allows our teachers to work in larger Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) enabling for greater collaboration, sharing and ongoing development of their teaching practices. These larger teams will also see a greater range of teachers planning for each group of students, bringing their own strengths and experiences to these conversations.

It is important to note that all classes, whether a single year level or multi-age class group, have children with diverse learning needs and abilities. When planning for student learning, teachers take into consideration the strengths, prior knowledge and the needs of every student. They use this as a starting point to design the learning and work from where each child is currently at. In any class, there will be teaching and learning that occurs as a whole class, in small groups and at an individual level.

Research tells us that high quality teaching and learning is the key to a successful learning environment in any classroom, not the structure or the makeup of the class.

## 2024 Grade Placement Requests

I do like to invite parents/carers to put in writing any information about their child/ren that they want considered by our staff as we go about forming our new grades for 2024. The information you provide should focus on your child's needs (whether they be academic, medical, physical, emotional or social) and the type of person that you believe they respond to best. Please refrain from identifying a specific teacher as it may lead to disappointment for you and your child/ren. We ask that you complete a request even if you have communicated with a staff member at any stage during the year as this will ensure we have an up-to-date record.



A new request also needs to be completed if you have made a request in previous years. To ensure we have a centralised place for all the requests we ask that you submit a separate request via the link below, for each of your children and be mindful that naming specific teachers or friends will not be considered as this makes the process far too difficult. This feedback may guide us in our placement decisions, but no promises can be made.

Requests must be submitted by 9am on Monday 13th November. Using this information we can then endeavour to select the teacher who we think will best meet your child/ren's needs, as well as the needs of their 2024 classmates.

It is important that families understand that feedback offered outside this timeline will not be accepted, although consideration may be made in exceptional circumstances. We thank you for your support in this process. Please note, that whilst your letter will be officially acknowledged as being received, the outcome of your child/ren's placement will occur using the same process and timeline as all other children. This is in keeping with the spirit of fairness for all.

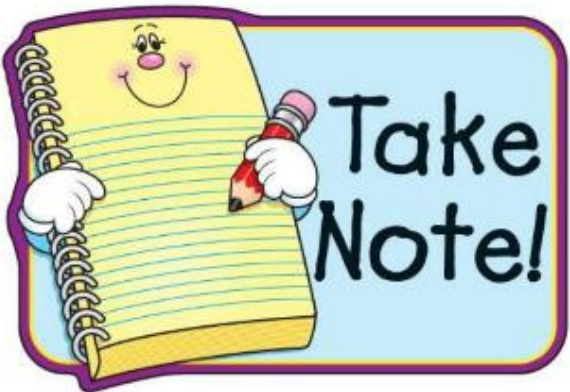


### Art Show

# Term Four Learning Goals

## Literacy

## Numeracy

### Prep

- Retelling stories using the five elements - characters, setting, beginning, middle and end.
- Writing sentences with an uppercase letter at the start and a full stop at the end.
- Planning and writing a simple narrative.
- Developing speaking and listening skills through Show and Tell activities.

- Using a range of strategies to help solve addition and subtraction problems.
- Identifying important information in worded addition and subtraction problems and writing the relevant number sentence using +, -, =.
- Making and ordering numbers beyond 20.
- Using the terms likely and unlikely to make a prediction about the probability of an event.

### Grade 1/2

- Writing poetry, persuasive and narrative texts that include the appropriate features, structure and vocabulary.
- Using comprehension strategies to derive meaning and answer literal, inferential and multiple-choice questions about texts.
- Identifying alternative spellings for phonemes (sounds) and applying this to correctly spell words.
- Applying growing grammar knowledge to structure grammatically correct sentences and enhance written and spoken communication.

- Measuring, comparing and ordering shapes and objects based on length, area, volume and capacity.
- Recognising and describing one-half as one of two equal parts of a whole and interpreting common uses of halves, quarters and eighths of shapes and collections.
- Revising number concepts including place value, number patterns and number operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Identifying and classifying activities and events according to how likely they are to happen, using the language of chance.

### Grade 3/4

- Planning, drafting and publishing persuasive texts.
- Identify high modal verbs to add weight to persuasive arguments.
- Using comprehension strategies to build literal and inferred meaning to expand content knowledge, integrating and linking ideas and analysing and evaluating texts.
- Discussing literary experiences with others, sharing responses and expressing a point of view.

- Modelling and representing fractions including  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{8}$ ,  $\frac{1}{5}$ .
- Investigating equivalent fractions in context.
- Measuring, ordering and comparing objects area, mass and capacity.
- Reviewing, extending and problem solving using the four operations (+, -, x, ÷).

### Grade 5/6

- Planning, drafting and publishing persuasive texts using language features appropriate to purpose and audience.
- Identifying modal verbs in reading and use within persuasive writing to influence the reader.
- Using comprehension strategies to read increasingly complex text to consolidate meaning.
- Reading and creating poetry such as ballads, odes, lyrics, sonnets and free verse

- Making connections between equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Constructing, interpreting and comparing a range of different data displays.
- Measuring, calculating and comparing elapsed time.
- Problem solving using reasoning with open ended investigations.

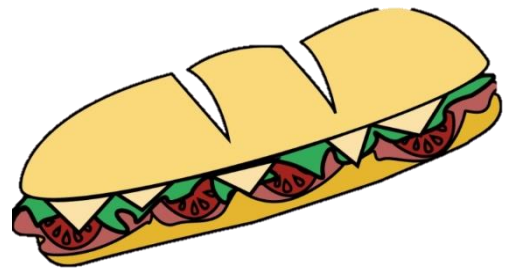

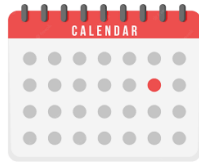

In our care, children make new friends, build on old friendships, get exercise, eat healthy food, embrace their imagination and have loads of fun in a safe and respectful environment.

Our after-school care program is run by Village OSHC. They operate **After School Care from 3.30pm to 6pm Monday to Thursday.**

All families are strongly encouraged to register their child/ren for VillageOSHC as it is free to enrol and while you are under no obligation to use this service it does provide support for you in the event of an emergency. ## MOBILE DEVICES

In line with the Department of Education's [Mobile Phone policy](#), all phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely in the front Office, during the school day.

A **mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to **mobile phones and any device** that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smartwatch.

## SAFETY

**All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.**

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

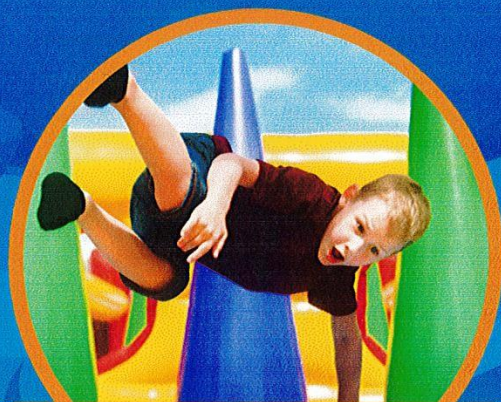

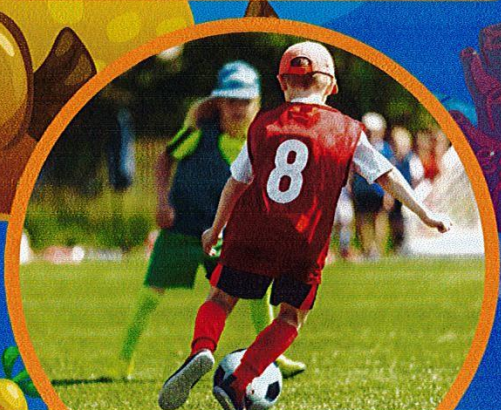

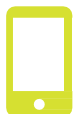
