Hi everyone,

I did want to share that most days I get to greet the students and the children's manners are on display, highlighting a level of respect. Given manners are not something children are born with it takes a lot of work in the early years to ensure they stick, so I commend your efforts in making sure manners are a high priority.

Here is an example of a typical exchange I can have in the morning:

Mrs Ellaby: Good morning, lovely to see you!

Child: Good morning, Mrs Ellaby! How are you today? Mrs Ellaby: I am fine, thank you. And how are you? Child: I am good. I hope you have a good day.

Mrs Ellaby: Thank you! I hope you have a good day too!

A feature of this typical exchange is that the child will **use a confident voice, look me in the eye, smile** and **show genuine care and attention**. Now and then, a child will even go the extra mile by saying something kind like, "I really like your dress".

I encourage you to consider how far a child who can perform this exchange well, might do in life. Thinking of your workplace, how many adults can perform this exchange well and then, how do you feel about them?



Grade Formation Process

I would like to take the opportunity to thank those families that took up my option to make a request, in line with the process outlined in previous newsletters. We are now <u>no longer able to accept</u> any further requests given that our grade formation process has begun. We will now put an enormous amount of time and effort into trying to meet the needs of our students, staff, parents and carers, all with the aim of trying to make every student approach their 2024 school year with confidence and enthusiasm.

Given the many unknowns at this time of the year, you can help us by building your child/ren's resilience with some positive talk about the importance of developing friendships and working relationships with new people and that 'in life we don't always get what we want'. With so many factors to consider, to make these grades balanced, we aim to provide your child with at least one nominated friend. If your child is in a grade with more than one nominated friend, then that is good luck and not by design.

I would like to thank those parents/carers who refrained from nominating a specific teacher or listing their child's friends and instead gave us guidance as to the type of teacher they believed would best suit their child. This approach makes our job a lot easier. To those who identified a specific teacher or friends, we took no notice due to the fact that this makes the process far too difficult. If by chance your child does end up with the 'teacher or friend/s of your choice', then you can consider that pure luck. Students will find out their 2024 class on our 'Meet the teacher' session on **Tuesday 12 December**.



Art Show

We will be Celebrating the Artist in You at our Art Show on **Thursday 23 November** from 3.45pm till 5pm.

Students have been busy preparing their artwork, with support from their classroom, which will be on display throughout the TOC from 3:45pm till 5pm.

For students permitted to perform, between 4pm and 5pm, they will be performing with their classmates. With the performance starting at 4pm students can be supervised at school from 3:30pm until the show starts. However, we do ask that you pack a little extra afternoon snack to help them get through until 5pm.

All families are welcome to come along to watch this special performance. If you are staying to watch, we do ask that you refrain from filming and/or photographing this performance in the interest of our children's safety.

At 5pm, an adult will need to come into the TOC to collect your child so please do not plan for them to meet you outside of the TOC.



SHARING OUR OF LEARNING





In the Grade 3/4 Unit



READING:

In reading, we have been working on interpreting, analysing and evaluating texts.

Students have been working on **interpreting** a text by using literal information and drawing upon their schema (prior knowledge) to make a sound inference.



We have been **analysing** how different texts use verb groups to represent different processes. Students have been learning about how to differentiate between action, saying, thinking and relating verbs.

We have been displaying our comprehension by answering literal, inferential and evaluative questions about our weekly reciprocal reading texts.

ART:

This term for art, we have focused on self-portraits. Many students have chosen to create a self-portrait for the Art Show and are excited to showcase this to the school community.

Students have been inspired by famous artists and have created abstract pieces which portray their inner and outer selves.




WRITING:

In writing this term we have focused on persuasive writing and narrative writing.

Everyone in the cohort wrote a letter to Mrs Ellaby persuading her of why they should be chosen for Principal for a day. First, we created a brainstorm of strong leadership qualities and then we revisited our modal verbs.

We have been revisiting the story planning mountain as a way to build upon our ideas. Through our mentor texts, we have been exploring ways to begin our narratives and add detail to our writing.



INOUIRY

Our mentor text this term has been 'Tea and Sugar Christmas' by Jane Jolly and Robert Ingpen. The story focuses on the Tea and Sugar Train, which travelled from Port Augusta to Kalgoorlie once a week from 1915 to 1996.

The students have been stepping into the shoes of Kathleen, the protagonist, and creating a budget which details their weekly meals and groceries.

A range of text-to-self, text-to-world, and text-to-text connections have been made. Through these comparisons, students have been able to recognise the differences and similarities between their lives and Kathleen's.





MATHS

For maths, we have focused on measuring lengths up to 1m, 100m, and 1km. We recently went on a local walking excursion. Through the use of the trundle wheel, we found out that there is exactly 1km between Wooranna Park PS and Lyndale Secondary College.

Students have also been working on refining their measurement skills through our volume and capacity unit. Students have shown an ability to estimate, measure and compare the volume of different sized containers.





SHARING OUR



OF LEARNING

PHYSICAL CHANGES IN JUNIOR SCHOOL

Students in Prep and in grades 1/2 have been investigating and observing the physical changes that occur all around us. We've looked at the different ways we can apply force to different objects such as scrunching, bending, folding and stretching. The students had to predict, observe, record through drawings and explain what they learnt about the properties of these objects.

CHEMICAL SCIENCE IN SENIOR SCHOOL

The students in Grades 3/4 and 5/6 learned the science skills required to be a 'change detective.'


They needed to predict or hypothesise, and record observations with drawings, data collection, and notes to investigate how physical and chemical changes can occur to a variety of different objects. We did lots of different experiments to try and explain what changes are physical or chemical and which of those could be reversed.

 Parents/carers who currently receive CSEF, and who remain eligible, will automatically have their
 2024 application processed by the school. For all applications, we will require a copy of your
 current Health Care Card.

Any information about your financial circumstances, payment arrangements or status will be kept strictly confidential.



Payment Methods

Refunds

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all
 items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum
 requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES




