Hi everyone,

On a following page is the learning structure for Wooranna Park PS for 2024. A huge amount of time and effort has gone into trying to meet the needs of our students, staff and families all with the aim of trying to set every student up for success in the 2024 school year, with both confidence and enthusiasm. If your child is concerned by their placement, which they will find out on Tuesday 12 December, you can help us by building your child/ren's resilience with some positive talk about the importance of developing friendships and working relationships with new people and that 'in life we don't always get what we want'.

With so many factors we have had to consider to make these grades balanced, we have aimed to provide your child with at least one nominated friend. If your child is in a grade with more than one nominated friend then that is good luck and not by design. It is important to respect that we will not be taking further requests, as at this late stage of the process any changes affect other students as well. I would like to thank those families who refrained from nominating a specific teacher or listing their child's friends and instead gave us guidance as to the type of teacher they believed would best suit their child. This approach made our job a lot easier. To those who identified a specific teacher, we took no notice due to the fact that this makes the process far too difficult. If by chance you did this and ended up with the "teacher of your choice" then you can consider that pure luck.

You will notice that we have some shared grades, almost one in each year level. As I am sure you can appreciate, teachers are the same as most other people in the workforce in that they are entitled to work in a part time capacity. This is common practice in most schools and here at Wooranna Park. In these situations, teachers communicate regularly to plan the learning program as well as establish shared classroom routines and practices. In most of these arrangements these teachers are well known by our community, therefore teachers in these classes are very experienced and have been teaching at Wooranna Park for a significant time so they are aware of our school processes. Most have successfully shared a grade previously and all have solid communication protocols.

You will notice some familiar names are missing including Anessa Quirit, Lucia Hetherington, Mel Fitzgerald and Pip Varszeghy as they will each be pursing new oppournities in 2024. 



 Parents/carers who currently receive CSEF, and who remain eligible, will automatically have their
 2024 application processed by the school. For all applications, we will require a copy of your
 current Health Care Card.

Any information about your financial circumstances, payment arrangements or status will be kept strictly confidential.



Payment Methods

Alternatively, Wooranna Park Primary School will be open as of **29 January 2024** to receive parent contributions at the office via **EFTPOS.**

Refunds

Parent/carer requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

We shared some quality time learning new games.




We worked on our measurement skills by estimating, measuring and creating a 3D model of our shoe and we worked on our problem solving strategies.



Body Safety

As part of our wellbeing sessions and following the Kids Roar incursion, students have been



introduced to the concept of 'Body Safety'. Body safety education empowers children, helping them recognise and communicate about inappropriate behaviours or touch, understanding their body's warning signs and consent. By fostering this awareness, we're not only protecting them from potential harm but also setting a foundation for healthy relationships and self-respect as they grow.

Teaching children respect for their own and others' bodies helps empower them and reduces their chances of becoming victims.

The federal government have launched a campaign called "One Talk at a Time", it aims to help prevent child abuse by encouraging adults to have ongoing, proactive, preventative conversations with children and young people. The campaign is aimed at adults with children and young people in their lives. **All children have the right to be safe from abuse.** We all have a role to play in creating safe environments for children and young people.

Conversations have the power to prevent abuse.

You might not be an expert in the topic, but no one knows the people in your life better than you do.

You are the RIGHT person to have conversations with children and young people around you. The campaign has released advertisements aimed at having one conversation at a time. You can watch it here:

7 KEY BODY SAFETY MESSAGES

- TALK openly with your child ensure they know they can talk to you about anything!
- TELL your child never to keep secrets that make them feel bad and uncomfortable, even if threatened.
- BE WARY of people who are always 'there' to help out and who take a special interest in your child.
- WATCH for out-of-character behavioural changes in your child and investigate.
- 5. LISTEN to your child, even when you are busy and everything else seems more important – abused children often drop hints in conversation to gauge your reaction.
- ALWAYS believe your child when they tell you about any forms of abuse; reassure them of your love and that they were never to blame – your initial reaction to a disclosure is very important.
- EDUCATE your child in body safety before they are in the abuser's web, and their lives are changed forever.

Debunking 6 Myths About Body Safety Education



They won't. They will be empowered. This knowledge will keep them safe. It is far better that they are educated than have their childhood stolen. Childhood sexual abuse

2 Sex and the act of sexual abuse will be discussed

When we teach road safety, we don't show children graphic images. Similarly, when we teach body safety, it is age-appropriate and non-threatening. Sex and the act of sexual abuse is never mentioned.

3 My child is too young to be educated in body safety

3 to 8 years is the most likely age for a child to be sexually abused. The younger you start to educate the better! As soon as they begin to talk — start!



4 'Stranger Danger' education is all my child needs

85% of abusers are known to the child. They will be a trusted family member, friend or in your community. Predators are amongst us. They can be anyone!

Why raise this when my child will never be sexually abused?

1 in 5 girls and 1 in 8 boys will be sexually abused before their 18th birthday. Your child is more likely to be sexually abused than

My child doesn't need Body Safety Education; they tell me everything

A child can be so threatened and terrified to keep 'the secret', they may never tell. 73% of child victims do not tell in the first year, 45% do not tell in the first 5 years and many

To help prevent any form of abuse we encourage adults and trusted family members to regularly have open, safe, ongoing, proactive, and preventative conversations with the children and young people in your lives.

Conversations have the power to prevent abuse and change lives.


Teachers on play support will be reminding students that **No Hat makes for No Play**. Students without an approved hat will be directed to remain in a shaded area.

SAFETY

SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S EDUCATION WITH 12 MONTHS FREE INTERNET AT HOME

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative to provide free home internet for up to 30,000 eligible families with school-aged students:

- The period in which a family can apply to receive a free service is up to 31 December 2024
- The duration of free services will continue until 31 December 2025 for all existing and new families

The initiative aims to boost education opportunities. NBN Co is leading the rollout of this initiative across the country.

How the School Student Broadband Initiative can help your child

Children who can access online learning at home as part of their education are more likely to engage in classroom activities.

Access to fast internet at home can also support children to build their digital skills, learn how to safely use the internet and take part in a world that is more reliant on digital technology.

Eligibility

To be eligible, families must:

- have a child living at home enrolled in an Australian school
- not have an active National Broadband Network (nbn) internet service at their home(having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility)
- live in a premises that can access the National Broadband Network through a standard connection. NBN Co will check this for you after you apply
- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days*
- register interest with your school and complete a consent form to be assessed for eligibility.

How the School Student Broadband Initiative works

If you are eligible, your home internet service will be provided at no cost through until the end of 2025, with a participating internet provider on the National Broadband Network. Each internet provider has its own process to get you connected, which may involve you providing identification.

Once you sign up, the internet provider will help you set up your connection. The initiative does not include devices such as a computer or tablet. Other members of your household can use the internet service provided through this initiative.

The period of free internet will start from the day your service is activated with your chosen provider. At the end of the free broadband period, you will not be placed onto a paid service by your internet provider without your consent. The Australian Government is considering options beyond the free period.

^{*} There may be cases where exceptions can be made, once you have had your address checked, please contact the School Student Broadband Initiative team at SSBI@education.vic.gov.au to discuss further.

How to apply

- Ask your school for a copy of the School Student Broadband Initiative consent form.
- Complete the consent form and return to the school.
- NBN Co will use student address details on the consent form to confirm eligibility.
- If you are eligible, NBN Co will issue a voucher for your family to use to sign up with a participating internet provider. This will be provided to you by your school.

Please note: NBN Co will review the home address for eligibility. No personal information other than your main home address will be shared with NBN Co. Please see the consent form for details about how personal information will be used.
