Hi everyone,

It has been such a wonderful start to the 2024 school year!

I would like to congratulate everyone who contributed to the set up for this school year. It is certainly a big process which commenced in about September 2023. Judging by the way all 248 students (including all our 33 brand new Preps) have started, it is obvious the effort and thought we put into our transition program has certainly paid off! Congratulations to staff and parents/carers for instilling such confidence and for being so supportive, to each one of them.

I would also like to acknowledge the incredible support of our **WPPS families** through your financial contributions, as part of your annual payments. We are very lucky that the government funds lots of great things for our kids but know that your contributions enables us to run this school to its fullest capacity, including your support to resource our Library, beautiful grounds and playgrounds, Literacy and Numeracy Resources and our technology, which helps to engage our students.

During the holiday break we certainly made the most of the opportunity to maintain and spruce up our school's environment. **Tony and Yvette Gregorovich** made such an effort renewing our grounds and facilities, including a new boat play area for our Year 3/4 students. Our **Administration team**, with support from **Suraya**, came in to help with setting up for 2024, either in the Office or by allocating supplies to the classrooms ready for your children. **Many staff** interrupted their well-earned holidays and came into school to prepare and to organise their classrooms and responsibilities for this year. A big **thank you** to everyone that contributed to ensuring the learning environment at Wooranna Park was the best it could be for all of us as we returned to school!

I would like to extend a warm welcome to the new families that have joined our Wooranna Park Primary School community this year. We hope you have found us to be a welcoming community as you settle in to our school's routines.



This year **Dan Alexander**, **Bethany Schlag**, **Leanne Vancuylenberg** and **Steve Gilbert** have joined our teaching teams. **Becki Kinsella** has also joined us as our Inclusion Leader. Becki brings to our school a level of experience having worked in student wellbeing in both primary and secondary school settings. Becki is keen to build on her leadership experience in support of further developing our welcoming and inclusive community culture. Please feel free to introduce yourself to Becki when you see her around the school.

For the **first two weeks of this year** our staff are working with their students to create a culture where everyone inspires and encourages each other's learning. Embedded in this time is the opportunity to collectively set the tone for the year. This includes working and talking with the class to establish a shared vision and mission, enabling each class to understand what they are striving for together and what needs to be adhered to, in the interest of being the ultimate learning environment. You will hear more about these agreements, as each classes' commitments will be communicated to families, helping you to be able to play an important role in your child's learning.

As part of our formal communication processes, we will be having **'Getting to Know You' interviews** on Tuesday 13 and Wednesday 14 February from 3.50pm to 5:50pm, for families with students in grades one through to six.

We invite you to come along and meet with your child's teacher for a 10 minute discussion. This discussion will provide an opportunity for you to:

- Share information about your child so that the teacher has a comprehensive understanding of their individual circumstances
- Assist the teacher in identifying the personal learning needs of your child
- Ask any questions that you may have regarding the school's programs and curriculum.



As this evening will occur early in the term it is important to understand that the purpose of this discussion is for the teacher to become acquainted with your child and family.

On this occasion the teacher will not be reporting on your child's academic progress.

This year you will book your interview time through XUNO. You will now be able to book your child/ren's interviews from the comfort of your own home, either via the XUNO family app (on your phone) or the [XUNO portal](#). Once you have made your booking you will be able to see the details under confirmed appointments. Instruction resources on how to do this are available at:

If you do not have access to XUNO, you are more than welcome to contact your child's teacher or our Office directly on 9795 2007 and they will book you in personally through the system.

Our Prep families will get to meet with their child's teacher at their allocated Wednesday assessment and interview time.

Your next formal opportunity to meet with your child's teacher will be at our **Student Led Conferences** in **July 2024**. More information will be communicated closer to this date however, I just wanted to give you plenty of notice so you can include this date in your diary. Details of our other Student Free Days were communicated in our first newsletter that was sent home as a printed booklet. We hope this booklet has helped you to have all the necessary information relevant for the year ahead including our bell times, term dates and so much more!



Please note that **Monday 4 March** is a Curriculum Day, so students are not to come to school. All our staff will be involved in professional learning.

We appreciate your support in **signing** these notices for each of your children and returning them to your child's teacher or the Office ASAP.

Given the Department's position on **mobile phones in schools**, I did want to highlight our policy here at Wooranna Park. Included in this newsletter is the full policy endorsed by our School Council of which documents that, "a mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network". For the purpose of this policy, 'mobile phone' refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone, such as 'smart watches'. I ask that you familiarise yourself with this policy in support of your child/ren understanding our school's requirements and processes.

It is also very important that you update your child's medical profiles to ensure that we have their current medical information at the Office. If your child has **Asthma, Allergies or Hay Fever** you will need to provide an Action Plan for them. Blank copies are available on our website (in the [Back to School Checklist](#)) or from the Office. We encourage students to take all medications before school. Also as communicated in our [2024 Family Handbook](#), nominations will open on Monday 12 February for our election process for the **2024 School Council**.

Over the next 12 months this new group will meet monthly and together to:

- track the broad direction and vision for the school
- develop, review and update the policies of the school
- approve fundraising events for school related purposes
- exercise general oversight of the buildings and grounds, ensuring they are kept in good order and condition
- ensure all money coming into the hands of the council is properly expended
- ensure they take into account the views expressed by the school community, for the purpose of making decisions in the best interests of the school and our students
- ensure the annual report and school's strategic plan is published and available to the school community
- stimulate interest in the school in the wider community.

On Tuesday 26 March at 6:00pm we will host our **Annual General Meeting** which will then be followed by our first School Council meeting for 2024. As is the case for every School Council meeting, you are all welcome to attend.

This week we are focussing on our expectation of **we keep our hands, feet and body parts to ourselves**. This helps us to keep ourselves **safe**.

To teach a more appropriate way to engage with a friend, or someone we know is to **high five rather than hug**. With a high five we are both consenting to the contact.

This week Mrs Ellaby has been reminding everyone during the daily announcements that at Wooranna Park Primary School we high five instead of hug!

Our grade five and six students have been helping our younger students to learn this expectation by modelling how to high five instead of hug out in the yard all week.

We have also displayed posters around the school to help remind everyone of this expectation.

SHARING OUR OF LEARNING

It has been great meeting all our new preps. They have been busy getting to know each other and learning our classroom routines.

The preps have been exploring the prep playground and playing with each other, learning to make safe and responsible choices. The preps have also started going to Specialist classes. We asked the preps to draw us a picture of their first impressions of school and what they would like to learn. As part of our setting up for success program, the preps have been working on a class Vision and Mission Statement using the idea of 'Our Class is a Family'. They have discussed some of the ways our class can be a family including sharing, helping and being kind.



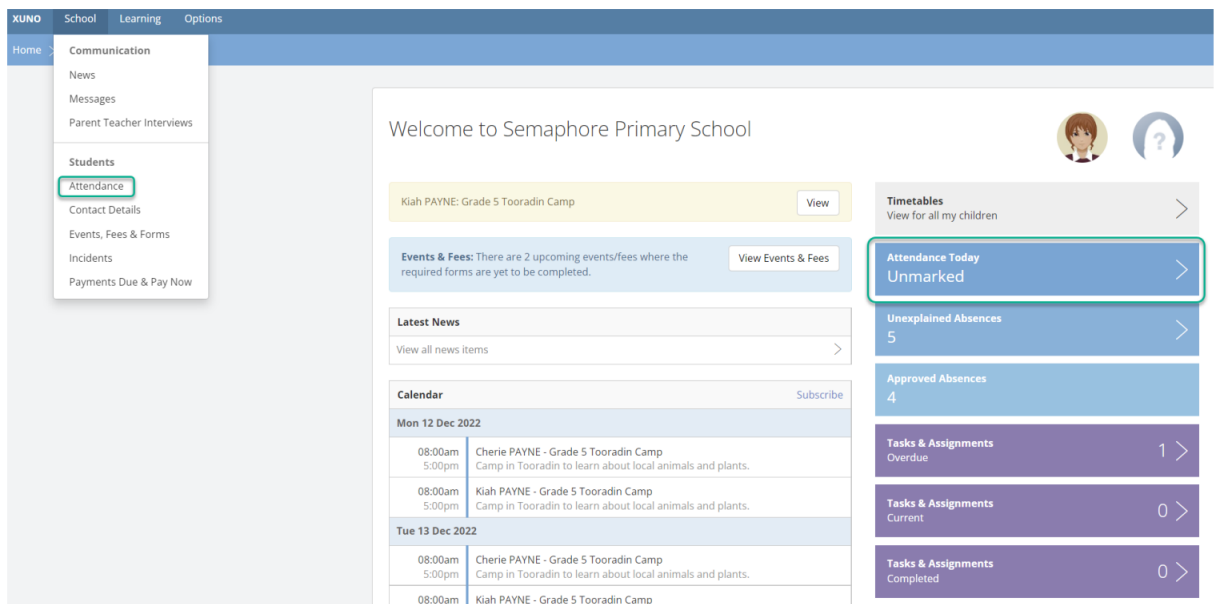

Portal: How to use XUNO to inform your school about a student absence

XUNO allows you to inform the school that your child will be absent on a specific date or time, either **today** or for a date in the **future**, before or after the roll has been marked. This feature is also available through the XUNO Family mobile app.

Submitting an absence note

1. Log in to your XUNO parent portal or XUNO Family app.
2. Via the **XUNO web portal**: From the **School** menu click on Attendance, or on the dashboard, click the blue **Attendance Today** tile.



Via the **XUNO Family app**: From the main menu, tap **Attendance**, or tap the blue **Attendance Today** tile.

3. If you have more than one child at the school, select the name of the child you are reporting an absence for.
4. Click/tap on the **Send absence note** button.

7. In the Reason given section, type the reason why your child will be absent on that day or period. It is best to keep the note short and precise, so that the school can quickly and easily process the information.
8. Click on **Save**. The school administration will be informed of your actions.
9. If you click on **View all future absence notes**, it may be possible to view and edit the future absence note. In some circumstances, the note will not appear in the list - this is usually due to the way the school manages the timetable - but don't worry! The school will have been notified about the absence note via email and will action it accordingly.

Please note, it is not possible to delete the absence notes - if you wish to withdraw the absence, you'll need to contact the school directly.

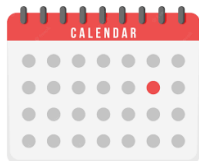

Please note that our school grounds are supervised by school staff at the following times:

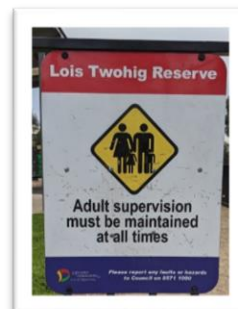
- Before school from 8:30am to 9am

Our gates are locked each afternoon at 3:45pm. Students in the school grounds after this time will be cared for at VillageOHSC at the family's expense.

It takes a village to raise a child and we are yours! Village OSHC partners with schools Australia-wide to keep children safe and happy outside school hours as parents work or study. In our care, children make new friends, build on old friendships, get exercise, eat healthy food, embrace their imagination and have loads of fun in a safe and respectful environment.

Our after-school care program is run by Village OSHC. They operate **After School Care from 3.30pm to 6pm, Monday to Thursday.**

All families are strongly encouraged to register their child/ren for VillageOSHC as it is free to enrol and while you are under no obligation to use the service it does provide support for you in the event of an emergency. MOBILE DEVICES

In line with the Department of Education's [Mobile Phone policy](#), all phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely in the front Office, during the school day.

A **mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to **mobile phones and any device** that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smartwatch.

When a student is not complying with this mobile phone policy, we will be required to follow a process in accordance with our existing student engagement policies.

SAFETY

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

PROTECT

If your concerns relate to a child in Years 1-6 a 'School Nurse Referral Form' will need to be completed. Please speak to your class teacher who can assist you with this. The school nurse can then contact you regarding your concerns.

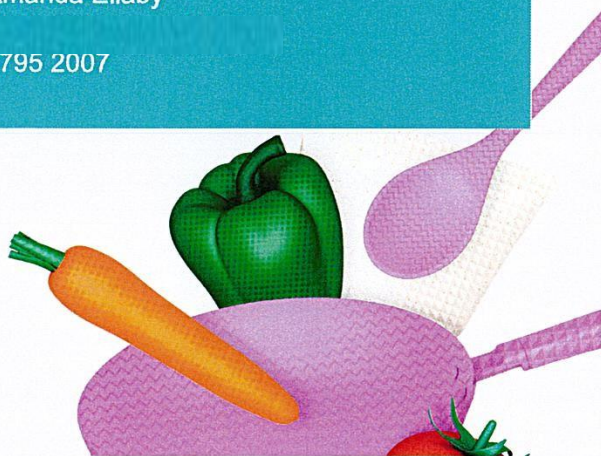

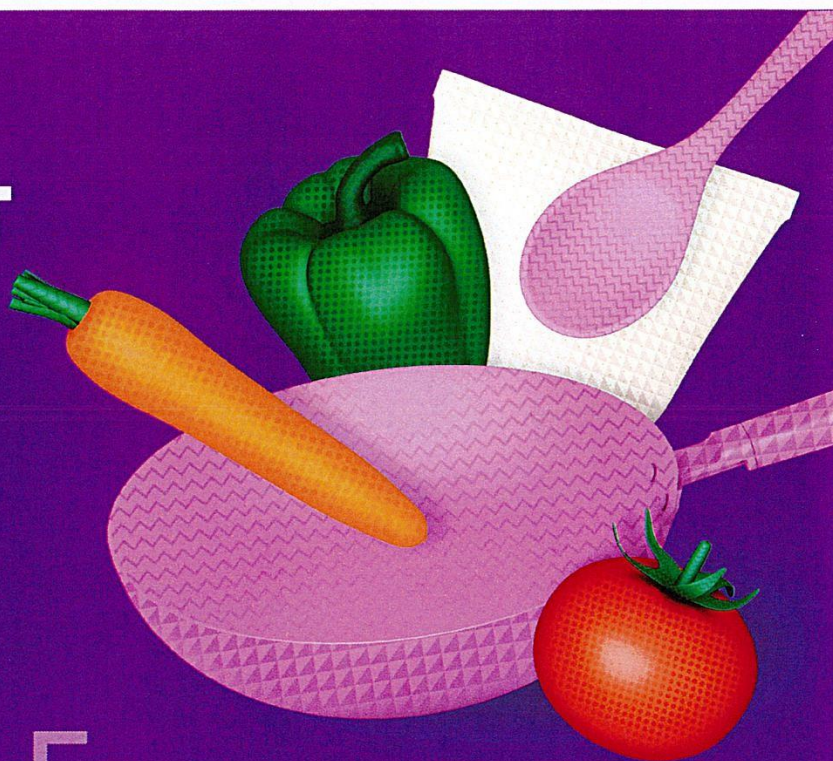

What you need to know

INVITATIONS

- The bus is an invitation only event.



MARKET DETAILS

- The duration of the market is 2hrs.
- We will need 30min either side of the market to set up and pack down.
- As the bus is 21 meters long, we may require some areas to be blocked off in advance.
- Must be parked on a flat surface.
- Needs substantial area for reversing and turning around.



ABOUT THE BUS

- 21 metres long
- 3 metres high X 3 metres wide
- Gross vehicle mass is approximately 28,000kgs (unladen)
- Fridge
- Freezer



MOBILE SUPERMARKET BUS

Foodbank Victoria (FBV) in collaboration with Kinetic (operators of SkyBus) have developed a bespoke Mobile Supermarket bus that can transport fresh produce, pantry items, chilled products and frozen food to communities facing food insecurity.

HOW IT WORKS

- The bus will pull up at a location and open its door to the community to enter and collect fresh food for free. Recipients will step on to the bus, walk down the aisle and pick produce from either side, including items from a fridge and freezer.
- The mobility of the bus allows FBV to link into many different locations across Metro Melbourne.
- Through our connections with local charities, schools, neighbourhood houses and Councils, the bus will explore new locations and areas where there are food deserts, limited access to charity agencies and local transport barriers.
- The Mobile Supermarket buses will give FBV an opportunity to reach more varied communities at a local level through direct delivery of fresh food.

THE BENEFITS

- Increase access to healthy, nutritious produce.
- Provide an environment that fosters community connectivity and inclusion.
- Help bridge the gap in perishable food relief programs.
- The bus provides food relief in an environment of dignity and respect – recipients choose their own produce just like a supermarket, but with no cost. The buses offer an opportunity for community to gather, connect and receive much needed food.

WHAT FOOD IS ON OFFER?

- Food items for the buses will reflect the communities they are feeding by ensuring they are culturally appropriate to the local cohort.
- The bus will be able to stock around 8 different fresh produce items, 15 different ambient pantry items, 2 chilled items and 2 frozen items.

FIND OUT MORE
