Hi everyone,

I did want to share that most days I get to greet the students and the children's manners are on display, highlighting a level of respect. Given manners are not something children are born with and it takes a lot of work in the early years to ensure they stick, so I commend your efforts in making sure manners are a high priority.

Here is an example of a typical exchange I can have in the morning:

Mrs Ellaby: Good morning, lovely to see you!

Child: Good morning, Mrs Ellaby! How are you today? Mrs Ellaby: I am fine, thank you. And how are you? Child: I am good. I hope you have a good day.

Mrs Ellaby: Thank you! I hope you have a good day too!

A feature of this typical exchange is that the child will **use a confident voice, look me in the eye, smile** and **show genuine care and attention**. Now and then, a child will even go the extra mile by saying something kind like, "I really like your dress".

I encourage you to consider how far a child who can perform this exchange well, might do in life. Thinking of your workplace, how many adults can perform this exchange well and then how do you feel about them?



We are now <u>no longer able to accept</u> any further requests given that our grade formation process has begun. We will now put an enormous about of time and effort into trying to meet the needs of our students, staff and parents, all with the aim of trying to make every student approach their 2025 school year with confidence and enthusiasm.

Given the many unknowns at this time of the year, you can help us by building your child/ren's resilience with some positive talk about the importance of developing friendships and working relationships with new people and that 'in life we don't always get what we want'. 


Mobile Phones in Government Schools



Curriculum Contributions

- State Schools' Relief provides support such as new school uniforms, shoes and more for disadvantaged families. Applications are submitted by the school.
- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible families to assist students
 to attend camps, sporting events and excursions. Application forms will be available at the office as
 of 28 January 2025 for new families or newly eligible families with a current Health Care Card.
 Parents/carers who currently receive CSEF, and who remain eligible, will automatically have their
 2025 application processed by the school. For all applications, we will require a copy of your
 current Health Care Card.

For a confidential discussion about accessing these services, or if you would like to discuss alternative payment arrangements, please contact our Business Manager, Sue Bitzios on 9795 2007 or sue.bitzios@education.vic.gov.au. Any information about your financial circumstances, payment arrangements or status will be kept strictly confidential.

Payment Methods

We will be accepting online payments via XUNO (Events and Fees) from 22 January 2025.

Alternatively, Wooranna Park Primary School will be open as of **28 January 2025** to receive parent contributions at the office via **EFTPOS**.

Refunds

Parent/carer requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access
 to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the
 requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the
 Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the
 Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

SUNSMART REMINDER

Just a reminder that <u>all</u> students and staff are expected to wear a named, broad brimmed navy-blue hat during any outside activities from the beginning of Term Four, until the end of April.

Teachers on play support will be reminding students that **No Hat makes for No Play**. Students without an approved hat will be directed to remain in a shaded area.

Wooranna Park Primary School encourages all staff and students to apply **SPF50 or SPF50+ broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen daily** whenever UV levels reach 3 and above. Sunscreen should be applied at least 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapplied every two hours (or more frequently if sweating or swimming).

Students and staff are encouraged to bring their own SPF50 or SPF50+ broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen to school.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.


