Purpose	The purpose of this policy is to outline the values of our school community and explain the vision, mission, and objectives of our school.
Policy	<p>Wooranna Park Primary School is committed to providing a safe, supportive, and inclusive environment for all students, staff, and members of our community. Our school recognises the importance of the partnership between our school and parents and carers to support student learning, engagement, and wellbeing. We share a commitment to, and a responsibility for, creating an inclusive and safe school environment for our students.</p> <p>The programs and teaching Wooranna Park Primary School support and promote the principles and practice of Australian democracy, including a commitment to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • elected government • the rule of law • equal rights for all before the law • freedom of religion • freedom of speech and association • the values of openness and tolerance. <p>This policy outlines our school’s vision, mission, objective, values, and expectations of our school community. This policy is available on our school website.</p> <p>To celebrate and embed our Statement of Values and Philosophy in our school community, we</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • display posters and banners that promote your values in our school • celebrate our values in our school newsletter • provide awards and recognition for students who actively demonstrate the values • discuss our values with students in the classroom, meetings, and assemblies.
Vision	Wooranna Park Primary School’s vision is to create a bright future for every learner.
Mission	Wooranna Park Primary School’s mission is to be inclusive and welcoming so the foundations for life can be built.
Objective	Our school’s objectives are considered as part of the four yearly strategic planning process and reflected in the goals listed in our current School Strategic Plan (SSP). We also develop an Annual Implementation Plan to operationalise the goals and key improvement strategies contained in our SSP.

<p>Values</p>	<p>Wooranna Park Primary School's values are <i>safe, respectful, and responsible</i>.</p> <p>We respect ourselves, our school and each another, and understand that our attitudes and behaviours have an impact on the people around us.</p> <p>We are responsible learners, which means trying our hardest and doing our best.</p> <p>We protect ourselves, each other, and our environment to minimise any dangers or risk which might be harmful or cause injury.</p>
<p>Behavioural Expectations</p>	<p>Wooranna Park Primary School acknowledges that the behaviour of staff, parents, carers, and students has an impact on our school community and culture. We acknowledge a shared responsibility to create a positive learning environment for the children and young people at our school.</p> <p>Shared expectations of staff, parents, carers and students to support positive student behaviour are set out in the <i>Respectful, safe, engaged: shared expectations to support student behaviour statement</i>.</p> <p>Students are also supported by school staff to meet expected standards of behaviour as outlined in our <i>Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy, Inclusion and Diversity Policy, Bullying Prevention Policy</i></p> <p>Staff must follow our school and department policies and the <i>Victorian Public Service Code of Conduct and Values</i>. Teaching staff also adhere to the <i>Victorian Teaching Profession's Code of Conduct</i>.</p> <p>Parents and carers play a vital role in helping their child understand and meet shared behaviour expectations. Additionally, information about the expectations of parents and carers to ensure schools remain respectful and inclusive places is outlined in the department's <i>Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy</i>.</p>
<p>Unreasonable Behaviours</p>	<p>Schools are not public places, and the Principal has the right to permit or deny entry to school grounds (for more information, see our <i>Visitors Policy</i>).</p> <p>Unreasonable behaviour that is demonstrated by school staff, parents, carers, students, or members of our school community will not be tolerated at school, or during school activities.</p> <p>Unreasonable behaviour includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • being violent or threatening violence of any kind, including physically intimidating behaviour such as aggressive hand gestures or invading another person's personal space • speaking or behaving in a rude, aggressive, or threatening way, either in person, via email, social media, or over the telephone • sending demanding, rude, confronting, or threatening letters, emails, or text messages • discriminatory or derogatory comments • the use of social media or public forums to make inappropriate or threatening remarks about the school, staff, or students. <p>Harassment, bullying, violence, aggression, threatening behaviour, and unlawful discrimination are unacceptable and will not be tolerated at our school.</p> <p>Unreasonable behaviour and/or failure to uphold the principles of the <i>Statement of Values and School Philosophy</i> may lead to further investigation and the implementation of appropriate consequences by the Principal.</p>

	<p>At the Principal’s discretion, unreasonable behaviour may be managed by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • requesting that the parties attend a mediation or counselling sessions • implementing specific communication protocols • written warnings • conditions of entry to school grounds or school activities • exclusion from school grounds or attendance at school activities • reports to Victoria Police • legal action. <p>Inappropriate student behaviour will be managed in according with our school’s Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy and Bullying Prevention Policy.</p> <p>Our Statement of Values and School Philosophy ensures that everyone in our school community will be treated with fairness and respect. In turn, we will strive to create a school that is inclusive and safe, where everyone is empowered to participate and learn.</p>
