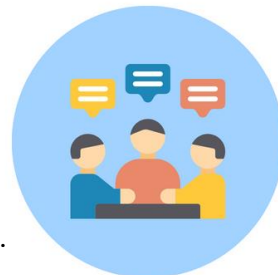

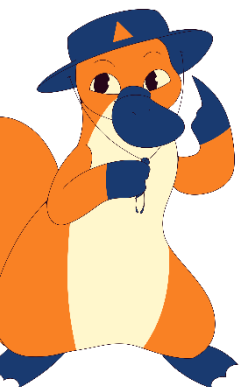
Hi everyone,

Thank you to everyone who is helping their child/ren to start their day calmly and positively by ensuring that they get all the important instructions from 9am. As a staff team, we help them to be ready to learn by opening our classroom doors from 8:50am.

KidsROAR Personal Safety Program

Later on in this term we will be engaging our students with [KidsROAR](#), an incursion to ensure our students are empowered about their rights (Child Safe Standard 3).

'We Are ROARsome' –Prep to Grade 4: The Primary Years Personal Safety Programs are designed to empower children with simple strategies if faced with an unsafe situation, including potential abuse.

Learning Intentions – At the end of the Program, students will be able to:



- Recognise safe and unsafe feelings
- Understand that we all have the right to feel safe at all times
- Identify and act upon early warning signs
- Know what consent is and why it is important
- Use and identify correct anatomical names for the private parts of their body
- Identify trusted adults they can talk to if they are feeling worried or unsafe
- Know that they can say 'NO' to an adult when they are feeling unsafe
- Persist in telling their trusted adults until they feel safe again
- Understand the difference between safe and unsafe secrets

We Can 'ROAR' Workshop – Grades 5 & 6: The Grade 5/6 'We Can ROAR' workshop supports students in establishing and maintaining respectful and safe relationships. This two hour interactive program not only includes further education on personal safety, but it also addresses the important concepts of Respect, Consent, Bullying and the Law, Consequences of Choices and Social Media Safety.

Respect and Consent

- Consent – What is Consent and why it is important?
- Obtaining and Giving Consent – Understanding Consent is reversible/mutual
- Types of Consent - When Consent is not Consent
- Respect – Self-Respect and Respecting others

Personal Safety

- Right to feel Safe – What does this mean for me and for others?
- Early Warning Signs – Identify and act upon early warning signs
- Private body parts – Identify and use correct anatomical names for the private parts of their body
- Secrets – Difference between safe and unsafe secrets
- Safety Network – Identify trusted adults they can talk to if they are feeling worried or unsafe
- Personal Safety & Technology – Social media, photos and safe communication

Choices – Legal Consequences

- Consent – not obtaining
- Bullying – understanding it is illegal
- Illegal Photos/Videos – possession and distribution
- Ripple Effect – of a criminal record

Time to Plan Ahead!

I respect that it is scary to think about 2026, but we are beginning to look at our enrolment numbers and whole school structure.

If you have any intentions to unfortunately leave WPPS in the next 6 months, please let the school office know ASAP. Your decision does not need to be confirmed and does not mean your child loses their spot if you change your mind but giving us a heads up is very helpful. This information is vital for the school to budget and plan for staffing in 2026. We do not want any children to be stuck in classes that are too big or only have a few kids, but this relies on us knowing who will be here.



If you suspect you may be moving house, travelling overseas or you know your visa is expiring, please communicate this to office as soon as possible.

And if you have a child starting school in 2026, we require your support submitting their enrolment form to the front office ASAP.

Planned industrial action at Victorian government schools

Dear Families,

Please be advised that **Thursday 23rd July** will be a **Stop Work Day**. Many teachers and school staff across Victoria will be taking part in a state-wide action in the city to ask the government for more support for schools.



At Wooranna Park:

- The school **will be open**, but it will be a **reduced learning day**.
- Families who wish to support educators may **consider keeping their children at home** on this day.

We thank you for your continued support and appreciation of our work. **All other days will be normal school days.**

Why this is happening:

- Staff at our school who are members of the Australian Education Union (AEU) have been negotiating with the state government for better pay and working conditions for the last seven months.
- Victorian public schools are currently the **lowest funded** in Australia, and there are significant staffing shortages.
- Teachers, education support staff, and school leaders are paid less than colleagues in other states, despite doing the same work.
- The AEU is asking for pay increases and reduced workloads to ensure schools can keep staff and continue providing high-quality education.

The decision to take industrial action is not taken lightly, and staff regret any inconvenience this may cause families. The government can avoid such action by offering fair pay and conditions.

We thank you for your continued support and appreciation of our work. We truly enjoy working with your children, and we value the opportunity to support their learning. We look forward to continuing this learning journey together.

You will receive further communication from the school as it gets closer outlining the arrangements for Thursday 23rd July.

Welcome to Term 3! Our Prep students have returned from the holidays full of enthusiasm and have settled back into classroom routines with confidence. It has been wonderful to see their growing independence as they confidently change their readers, settle into learning, read independently each morning and follow classroom learning routines with increasing confidence. In Mathematics, students have been exploring numbers to 20 and beyond using a variety of hands-on materials, including bundling sticks, ten frames and twenty frames, to strengthen and deepen their number understanding.



The students had a wonderful time participating in our Mindful Monkey incursion. They learnt strategies to calm their bodies, recognise their emotions and explore their senses through fun activities. They also made a glitter jar to take home to help practise calming techniques and manage big emotions.





Under The Sea - Term 2 Exhibition

Each week our classes earn points during their Specialists' class by:

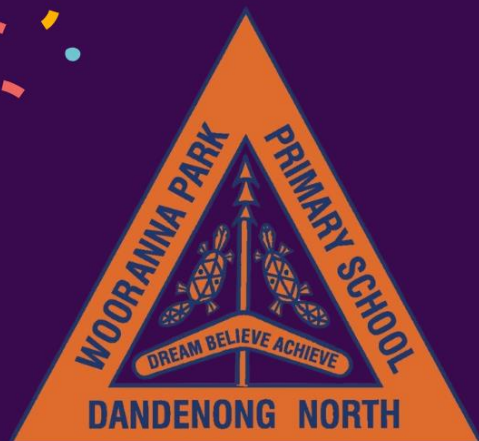
- Calmly using appropriate language when speaking to others (respect).

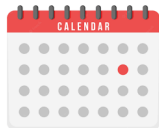

Please note that our school grounds are supervised by school staff at the following times:

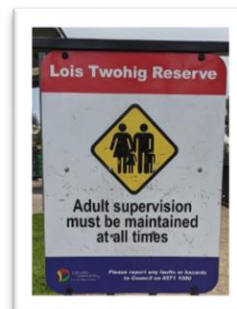
- Before school from 8:30am to 9am

Our gates are locked each afternoon at 3:45pm. Students in the school grounds after this time will be cared for at [DSSports](#) at the family's expense.

The school grounds are not supervised outside of the above times.

It is important that families understand that the park, opposite the school, is not supervised by staff before or after school.

While some families use this area as a meeting place, please know children must be supervised by an adult, as per the Greater Dandenong Council's direction.

MOBILE DEVICES

In line with the Department of Education's [Mobile Phone policy](#), all phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely in the front Office, during the school day.

A **mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to **mobile phones and any device** that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smartwatch.

When a student is not complying with this mobile phone policy, we will be required to follow a process in accordance with our existing student engagement policies.

SAFETY

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia

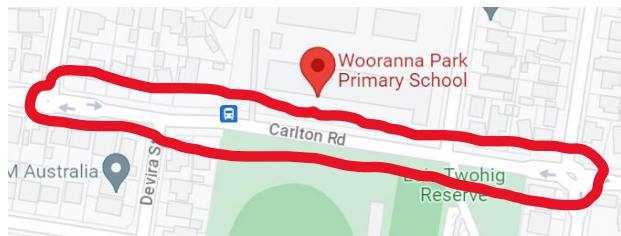


It is important that we model to our children Road Safety, by using the pedestrian crossing to cross the road and always follow the School Crossing Supervisors' directions.

As a driver you must **STOP** at the pedestrian crossings when someone is crossing the road. Please be advised that the pedestrian crossing on Apex Street is **no longer supervised**.



Please note, that while this is a convenient place to cross Carlton Road, it is not a supervised crossing and visibility is very difficult when cars are parked along both sides of the road.



Please use the roundabouts at each end of the school to safely turn around, rather than doing a U-turn in front of the school, particularly given there are a lot of young children around.



As the sign on the gate indicates, the **Staff Car Park** is for **Staff only**. The high volume of vehicles moving in and out increases the risk of accidents, especially since children may not be easily visible to drivers.



Please ensure that you travel at the **40kmph Speed Limit** around our school.

Helmets

Please make sure your child is safely fitted with a helmet before leaving home on either their bike or scooter. This illustrates that we are all working together to teach our children to stay safe and responsible whilst recognising that our young people need adult guidance and teaching on important routines such as helmets. The behaviour of staff, parents, carers and students has an impact on our school community and culture. We must acknowledge our shared responsibility to create a positive learning environment for the children and young people at our school

KISS & GO ZONE

We are a very lucky community with both Carlton Road and Wondalga Avenue available for parking before and after school.

It is important to understand that the parking directly outside of the school's main entry is a now **Kiss and Go Zone** before and after school. This means:

- **Do not leave your vehicle**

To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out.

- **Be timely**

If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.

- **Child safety**

Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.

- **Stay in sequence**

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.

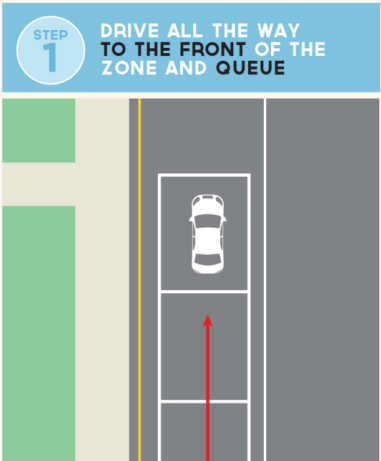
- **Driver duty of care**

Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.

- **No U-turns**

Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk

Please ensure that you travel at the **40kmph Speed Limit** around our school.

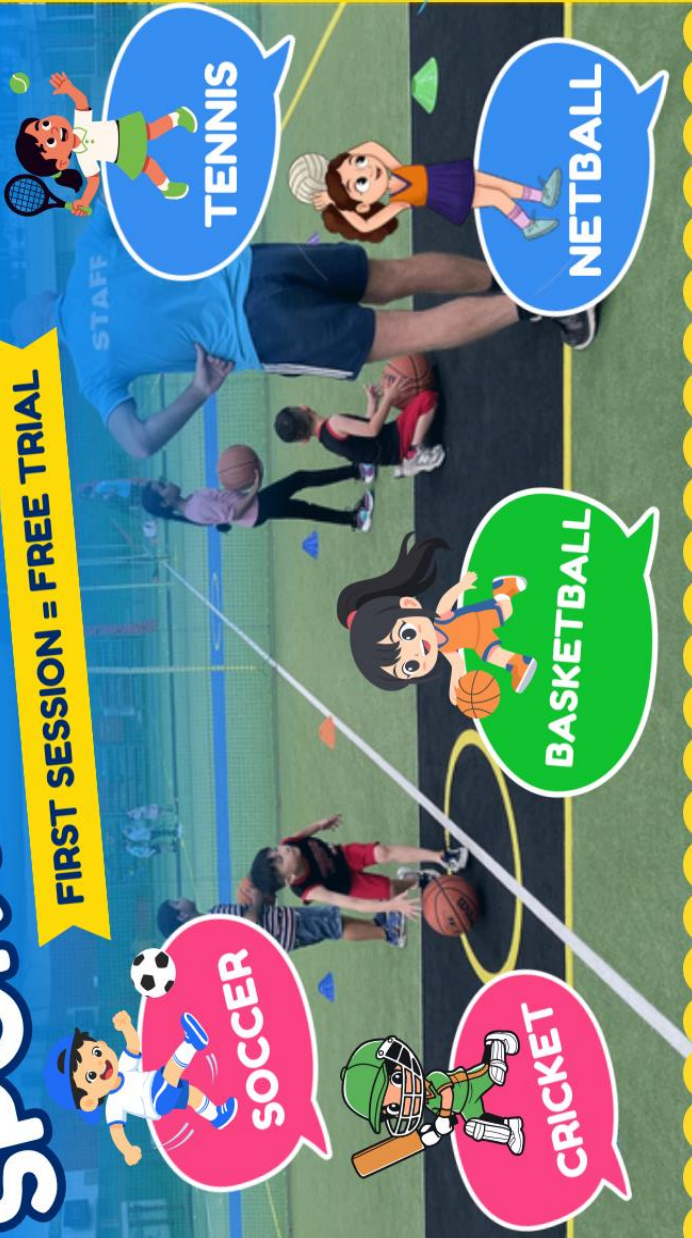
