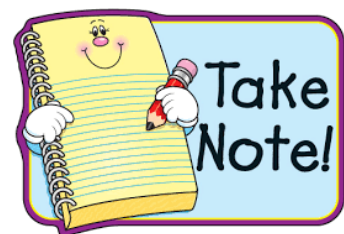

Department of Education Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage all families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Importance of School Attendance

Please remember that it is your responsibility to notify the school if your child is going to be late or away from school. You can log your child's absence by logging onto XUNO, calling the school on 9795 2007 or by sending an email to vooranna.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au



Please note that aligned to the Department's School Attendance Guidelines, we will keep a record of the reason given for each absence. The Principal will determine if the explanation provided is a **reasonable excuse** for the purpose of the parent/carer meeting their responsibilities under the *Education Training Reform Act 2006* and the School Attendance Guidelines.

If it is considered that the parent/carer has provided a **reasonable excuse** for their child's absence, the absence will be marked as '**excused absence**'.

If the school determines that no reasonable excuse has been provided, the absence will be marked as '**unexcused absence**'.

The Principal has the discretion to accept a reason given by a parent/carer for a student's absence. The Principal will generally excuse:

- medical and dental appointments, where out of hours appointments are not possible or appropriate
- bereavement or attendance at the funeral of a relative or friend of the student, including a student required to attend Sorry Business
- school refusal, if a plan is in place with the parent/carer to address causes and support the student's return to school
- cultural observance if the parent/carer notifies the school in advance
- family holidays where the parent/carer notifies the school in advance.

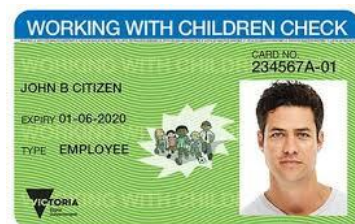
Child Safety Processes

This is a **requirement under Victorian law** and part of our school's commitment to upholding child safety standards.

I respect that it is scary to think about 2026, but we are beginning to look at our enrolment numbers and whole school structure.

If you have any intentions to unfortunately leave WPPS in the next 6 months, please let the school office know ASAP. Your decision does not need to be confirmed and does not mean your child loses their spot if you change your mind but giving us a heads up is very helpful. This information is vital for the school to budget and plan for staffing in 2026. We do not want any children to be stuck in classes that are too big or only have a few kids, but this relies on us knowing who will be here.

If you suspect you may be moving house, travelling overseas or you know your visa is expiring, please communicate this to office as soon as possible.

In the 3/4 Unit ...

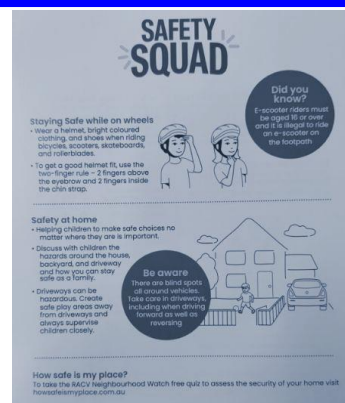
This term, our 3/4 students have enjoyed a range of exciting incursions and excursions that have helped connect their learning to real-life experiences.

On July 29th, students participated in the **Responsible Rubbish** incursion. They learnt about the different types of bins and what items belong in each one. Students explored why sorting rubbish correctly is important and how recycling can help reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill. They also learnt about the benefits of reusing and recycling materials and discussed simple ways they can make more environmentally friendly choices at school and at home. It was fantastic to see students sharing their ideas about how we can all play a role in looking after our environment.

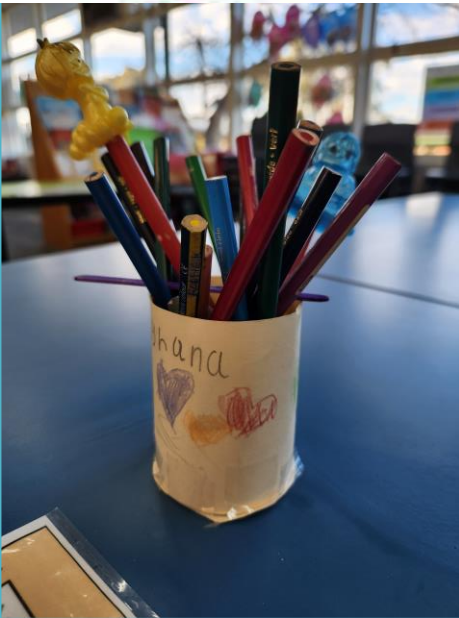


On August 5th, students took part in the **Kids Roar** incursion. Students learnt more about their bodies, personal boundaries and how to recognise situations that feel safe or unsafe. They explored the difference between safe and unsafe secrets and discussed the importance of speaking to a trusted adult if something makes them feel uncomfortable or worried. The session encouraged students to use their voices, ask for help and make safe choices.

On August 12th, the **RACV Safety Squad** visited our school for an engaging road safety session. Students learnt about important road rules and laws and discussed how to stay safe when travelling as pedestrians, cyclists and e-scooter riders. They explored safe behaviours such as wearing a helmet, being aware of their surroundings, following road signs and making responsible choices when using roads and shared paths. Students enjoyed sharing their own experiences and building their understanding of how they can keep themselves and others safe.



On August 17th, a selected group of students represented our school at **Hoop Time Basketball** at Dandenong Stadium. The students competed against other schools and demonstrated fantastic teamwork, sportsmanship and enthusiasm throughout the day. It was wonderful to see our students encouraging their teammates, celebrating each other's successes and showing respect to their opponents. A big congratulations to our Waves, Wolves and Wallabies for representing our school with such enthusiasm and pride.



Our Prep students have been exploring how designers create storage solutions. Students made and compared paper and cardboard stationery holders, then decided which material worked best for keeping their stationery organised.

Grade 1/2 students have continued exploring how materials can change. Students investigated different materials to discover whether they are flexible, inflexible, elastic or inelastic, using their observations to compare how materials behave when bent, stretched and changed.

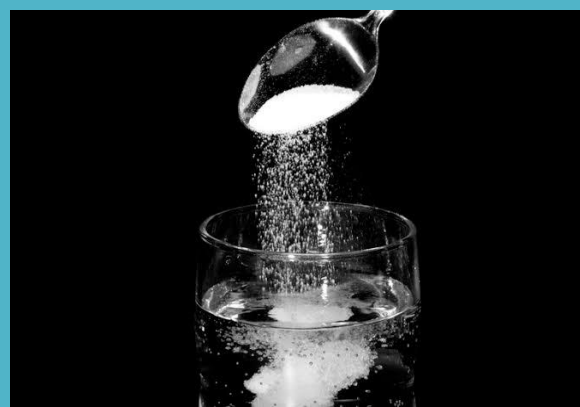

Grade 3/4 students have been exploring how heat affects materials. Students investigated melting ice and compared how different conditions affected the rate of melting, using their observations to explain why ice melted faster or slower



Grade 5/6 students have been exploring reversible and irreversible changes in everyday materials. Students investigated dissolving salt in water and considered how the salt could be recovered, using their observations to identify this as a reversible change.

- Caring for, looking after and using equipment for its correct purpose (safe).
- Worrying about ourselves and the things that affect us (responsible).

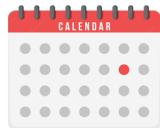

Please note that our school grounds are supervised by school staff at the following times:

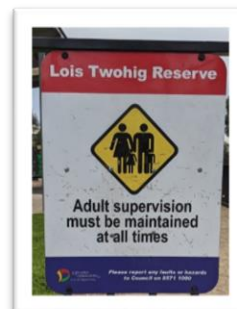
- Before school from 8:30am to 9am
- Throughout recess and lunch
- After school from 3:30pm to 3:45pm.

Our gates are locked each afternoon at 3:45pm. Students in the school grounds after this time will be cared for at [DSSports](#) at the family's expense.

The school grounds are not supervised outside of the above times.

It is important that families understand that the park, opposite the school, is not supervised by staff before or after school.

While some families use this area as a meeting place, please know children must be supervised by an adult, as per the Greater Dandenong Council's direction.

OUT OF HOURS SCHOOL CARE



DS Sports will be providing Outside School Hours Care at Wooranna Park Primary School from 3.30pm to 6pm, every afternoon, Monday to Friday.

DS Sports provides an adventurous and stimulating After School Care program, in a safe and inclusive environment.

DS zones are a place for growth and nurture the building of life-time skills. Our zones incorporate Health, Play, Leisure, Language, Real Life Connections and promotes the building of positive relationships with peers and our staff.

MOBILE DEVICES

In line with the Department of Education's [Mobile Phone policy](#), all phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely in the front Office, during the school day.

A **mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to **mobile phones and any device** that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smartwatch.

When a student is not complying with this mobile phone policy, we will be required to follow a process in accordance with our existing student engagement policies.

Subway lunch orders are available each Friday. There is a pre-ordering system and orders must be placed via XUNO **by 4pm each Tuesday** for the Friday's lunch.

SAFETY

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia

SAFETY EXPECTATIONS

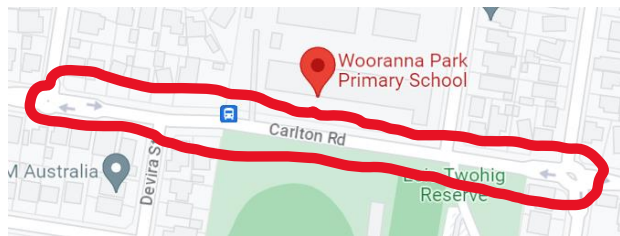


It is important that we model to our children Road Safety, by using the pedestrian crossing to cross the road and always follow the School Crossing Supervisors' directions.

As a driver you must **STOP** at the pedestrian crossings when someone is crossing the road. Please be advised that the pedestrian crossing on Apex Street is **no longer supervised**.



Please note, that while this is a convenient place to cross Carlton Road, it is not a supervised crossing and visibility is very difficult when cars are parked along both sides of the road.



Please use the roundabouts at each end of the school to safely turn around, rather than doing a U-turn in front of the school, particularly given there are a lot of young children around.



As the sign on the gate indicates, the **Staff Car Park** is for **Staff only**. The high volume of vehicles moving in and out increases the risk of accidents, especially since children may not be easily visible to drivers.



Please ensure that you travel at the **40kmph Speed Limit** around our school.

Helmets

Please make sure your child is safely fitted with a helmet before leaving home on either their bike or scooter. This illustrates that we are all working together to teach our children to stay safe and responsible whilst recognising that our young people need adult guidance and teaching on important routines such as helmets. The behaviour of staff, parents, carers and students has an impact on our school community and culture. We must acknowledge our shared responsibility to create a positive learning environment for the children and young people at our school

KISS & GO ZONE

We are a very lucky community with both Carlton Road and Wondalga Avenue available for parking before and after school.

It is important to understand that the parking directly outside of the school's main entry is a now **Kiss and Go Zone** before and after school. This means:

- **Do not leave your vehicle**

To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out.

- **Be timely**

If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.

- **Child safety**

Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.

- **Stay in sequence**

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.

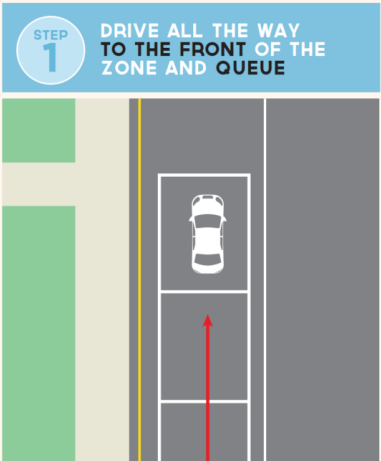
- **Driver duty of care**

Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.

- **No U-turns**

Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk

Please ensure that you travel at the **40kmph Speed Limit** around our school.
