Department of Education Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Attendance at School

Regular attendance at school gives every student the best opportunity to learn, build friendships, develop confidence and feel connected to our school community. **Every day matters** — being at school consistently helps students keep up with their learning, develop positive routines and make the most of the opportunities available to them.

According to the Education Department’s School Guide to Attendance:

Regular attendees: Miss less than 10 days a year (less than 5% absence)

Risk of Chronic Absence: Miss between 10 and 19 days a year (5-10% absence)

Chronic Absences: Miss 20+ days a year (10%+ absence, average of 1 day per fortnight)

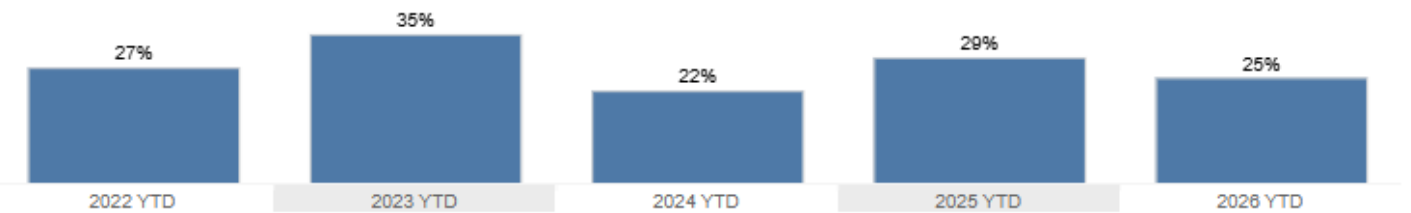
Severely Chronically Absent: 30+ days

When reflecting on our Year to Date (YTD) data we can see that 25% of our students at risk of chronic absence with already having had 15 or more absent days. This is an improvement on this time last year where we had 29% of students at risk of chronic absence

We are pleased to share that our attendance is currently tracking positively. At this time of the year, our percentage of students with 15 or more days of absence is the second lowest it has been over the past five years!

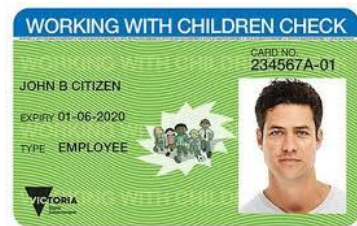
Child Safety Processes

I respect that it is scary to think about 2026, but we are beginning to look at our enrolment numbers and whole school structure.

If you have any intentions to unfortunately leave WPPS in the next 6 months, please let the school office know ASAP. Your decision does not need to be confirmed and does not mean your child loses their spot if you change your mind but giving us a heads up is very helpful. This information is vital for the school to budget and plan for staffing in 2026. We do not want any children to be stuck in classes that are too big or only have a few kids, but this relies on us knowing who will be here.

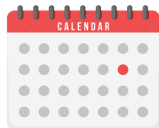

Please note that our school grounds are supervised by school staff at the following times:

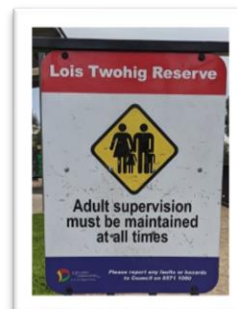
- Before school from 8:30am to 9am
- Throughout recess and lunch
- After school from 3:30pm to 3:45pm.

Our gates are locked each afternoon at 3:45pm. Students in the school grounds after this time will be cared for at [DSSports](#) at the family's expense.

The school grounds are not supervised outside of the above times.

It is important that families understand that the park, opposite the school, is not supervised by staff before or after school.

While some families use this area as a meeting place, please know children must be supervised by an adult, as per the Greater Dandenong Council's direction.

OUT OF HOURS SCHOOL CARE



DS Sports will be providing Outside School Hours Care at Wooranna Park Primary School from 3.30pm to 6pm, every afternoon, Monday to Friday.

DS Sports provides an adventurous and stimulating After School Care program, in a safe and inclusive environment.

DS zones are a place for growth and nurture the building of life-time skills. Our zones incorporate Health, Play, Leisure, Language, Real Life Connections and promotes the building of positive relationships with peers and our staff.

MOBILE DEVICES

In line with the Department of Education's [Mobile Phone policy](#), all phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely in the front Office, during the school day.

A **mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to **mobile phones and any device** that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as a smartwatch.

When a student is not complying with this mobile phone policy, we will be required to follow a process in accordance with our existing student engagement policies.

SAFETY

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia

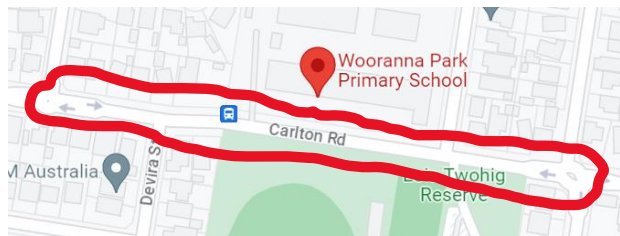


It is important that we model to our children Road Safety, by using the pedestrian crossing to cross the road and always follow the School Crossing Supervisors' directions.

As a driver you must **STOP** at the pedestrian crossings when someone is crossing the road. Please be advised that the pedestrian crossing on Apex Street is **no longer supervised**.



Please note, that while this is a convenient place to cross Carlton Road, it is not a supervised crossing and visibility is very difficult when cars are parked along both sides of the road.



Please use the roundabouts at each end of the school to safely turn around, rather than doing a U-turn in front of the school, particularly given there are a lot of young children around.



As the sign on the gate indicates, the **Staff Car Park** is for **Staff only**. The high volume of vehicles moving in and out increases the risk of accidents, especially since children may not be easily visible to drivers.



Please ensure that you travel at the **40kmph Speed Limit** around our school.

Helmets

Please make sure your child is safely fitted with a helmet before leaving home on either their bike or scooter. This illustrates that we are all working together to teach our children to stay safe and responsible whilst recognising that our young people need adult guidance and teaching on important routines such as helmets. The behaviour of staff, parents, carers and students has an impact on our school community and culture. We must acknowledge our shared responsibility to create a positive learning environment for the children and young people at our school

KISS & GO ZONE

We are a very lucky community with both Carlton Road and Wondalga Avenue available for parking before and after school.

It is important to understand that the parking directly outside of the school's main entry is a now **Kiss and Go Zone** before and after school. This means:

- **Do not leave your vehicle**

To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out.

- **Be timely**

If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.

- **Child safety**

Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.

- **Stay in sequence**

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.

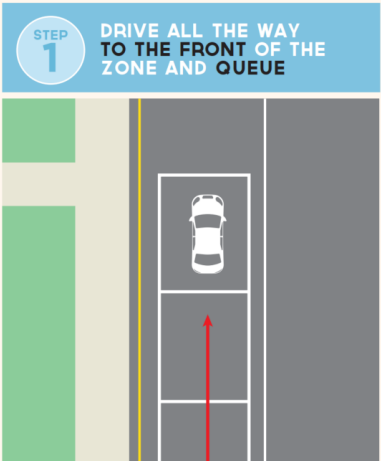
- **Driver duty of care**

Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.

- **No U-turns**

Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk
